



## Pineapple Cove Classical Academy Frequently Asked Questions

### 2018-2019 Application Process

**1. What is the application process?**

A: Parents can apply online or fill out a paper application. Applications are accepted in person, online or via fax. We do not accept applications by e-mail or U.S. mail. Applications turned in during the January 16-March 15 priority window will be entered into the lottery.

**2. How do I know if I've been accepted? What happens if I apply after March 15?**

A: The lottery will be held after March 15 and families will be notified of acceptance or wait list status by April 1 via U.S. Mail. Families who apply after March 15 will be added to the wait list in the order applications are received.

**3. How can I learn more about the school?**

A: Our website has extensive information about our curriculum, extra-curricular activities, and other items of interest. Alternatively, we have Information Nights scheduled and school tours scheduled for each Friday at 9:00 a.m. (See attached postcard).

**4. Do you teach Common Core?**

A: We do not teach Common Core. We teach our curriculum, which meets or exceeds Common Core standards. The standards taught in the state of Florida are the Florida State Standards.

**5. Do your students wear uniforms?**

A: Yes. Lands' End is our exclusive uniform provider. There are examples of our uniforms on our website.

**6. What are the class sizes?**

A: We follow the Florida class size constitutional amendment of 18 students per class in K-3 and 22 in 4-8.

**7. What is classical education? What make this school different?**

A: We prefer a more traditional method of teaching and learning. Refer to postcard for tenets of our curriculum.

**8. What about sibling preference?**

A: If one sibling is accepted in the lottery and the other siblings are wait-listed, we will prioritize completing families and accepting siblings based on sibling preference.

**9. What happens if we get accepted to both campuses?**

A: Parents of scholars accepted to both schools may choose their campus of preference.
